A writing from Amy Gingrich, MennoMedia Executive Director, dated 12/6/2023:

In 1934, a congregation in suburban Chicago found itself economically strapped. Just ahead of the Great Depression, the church constructed a new sanctuary and now couldn't afford the mortgage. They "uninstalled the telephone and slashed the pastor's salary in half" to cut costs.

Amid such cuts, two budget lines got an increase: "mission, because they knew they had more neighbors in need than ever before, and education, because they believed the Christian formation of their children was tantamount even in a season of scarcity," writes Katherine Willis Pershey, one of the church's current pastors ("Prayers Rising Past the Immanent Frame," Christian Century, September 2023).

Circumstances, cultural paradigms, and programs have changed and yet the needs articulated by that church in 1934 still resound: our neighbors are in need, children's Christian formation remains a priority. How are you and your congregation prioritizing what's most needed today and in the year ahead? Where do you cultivate hope and belonging? What programming cuts could make way for God to do a new thing? ~ In hope, Amy
