Join us today, Sunday, 02/02/2025, from 4-6pm at First Baptist Church of Richmond (2709 Monument Ave.) will host an ecumenical gathering celebrating the legacy of Anabaptism and its relevance for the church today. While a Zoom link will be available, we encourage in-person attendance for this special time of fellowship with other churches.

Greg Boyd, pastor, theologian, and prominent figure in the Neo-Anabaptism movement, will deliver the keynote address (via Zoom).
